Hello Ladies,

I encourage you all to invite an extraordinary woman educator to our next meeting on October 5th! You may have new members in mind, or perhaps there are members we last saw a while ago that you would like to reconnect with at the meeting; either way, I encourage you to reach out and invite them to come. During the August meeting, our Executive Council charged our chapter with continuing to grow our members by five women this year. This accomplishment only occurs when all our members strive to grow our chapter.

Growing our chapter is truly a team effort! While developing a student group in college, I was exposed to the statistic that if you personally



invite 25 people, 15 will say they will attend. Of those 15, usually eight to 10 will attend the event; of those, only five to seven will regularly attend after a month.

That is a lot of work for one person! Thankfully, we have a whole chapter of incredible women to take on this challenge!

We often talk ourselves out of inviting a new member because we decide for them by not asking them to join. We justify not asking women to participate by making excuses about our colleagues being "too busy" or that we do not know them well enough to invite them. However, it is a tremendous honor to be recognized as an excellent woman educator and is encouraging to be told that you are one in the eyes of others in your field. Asking women to join takes courage, but we must allow them to decide whether to join.

Remember Patti Belknap's story about an extraordinary educator she worked with for years and was never invited to be a member of DKG. She made the excuse that she had young kids and would not want to join their chapter. After several years, the young woman confessed that she would have loved to have joined DKG. She is now an active member of Delta Kappa Gamma. Is there an extraordinary educator you are hesitant to invite to our chapter? What if she

TRS COLA is on the November 7 ballot!

During the legislative session this year, the Texas Legislature approved a cost-of-living adjustment for TRS annuitants. But for this to be put into action, **Proposition 9, House Joint Resolution 2,** must receive the approval of Texas voters creating an amendment to the Texas Constitution to release the funding. Annuitants in the Teacher Retirement



System have not received a cost-of-living adjustment,

COLA, in ten years. Approving **Proposition 9** will not increase taxes because funds for this have already
